## LIFTING UP CLIENTS WITH HOME DELIVERIES

In the early weeks of the pandemic when COVID 19 started impacting neighbors in Mecklenburg Co., Loaves & Fishes was forced to close our 41 brick and mortar food pantries, switching to distributing groceries at drive through mobile pantries. Before long, we saw a new challenge arise, the importance of getting food to clients in quarantine. These clients had been infected by, exposed to, or were at high-risk of contracting the virus. We quickly pulled together resources and volunteers and coordinated a way to begin delivering groceries to these populations.

As word started to spread about the new Home Delivery Program, we realized we had the means to expand the program to our clients who are elderly, who do not have transportation, or are disabled. **Today, we are serving an average of 75 households per week, using a fleet of around 20 volunteers.**

Last month, we received a call from Dianne, who had just received a week's worth of groceries delivered directly to her doorstep. Dianne, age 79 and her grandson were amazed and grateful for all of the food. "You all are a Godsend," she said. "It did more than help, It lifted me." We are proud to say we will be continuing this home delivery program into the future, allowing us to serve more neighbors like Dianne. We are now one step closer to solving hunger in Mecklenburg County and have all of our dedicated volunteers, donors, and staff members to thank for it!

My father worked in a factory during the day, then my mother and he cleaned office buildings in the evening to feed and clothe six children. Powdered milk was affordable and you thought you were in heaven when you visited a home with "real" milk. I never went hungry and always had a hand me down winter coat. ## GROWING TO MEET THE NEED

Louise McCrorie joined the Loaves & Fishes team this year as our first ever Social Services Coordinator. She works closely with clients, making referrals and helping to connect them with other agencies -- a new resource we are able to provide for our neighbors in need. *"We got a call from a young person who had moved to Charlotte in April with her 3 young children, and was diagnosed with cancer in June," shares Louise. "She has a sister, but she cannot help this person much as she is caring for their elderly mother who has a terminal illness. We got her connected to CMS for the meal program, legal resources to assist with her disability claim, and information about help with utilities and her mortgage and how the process works."*

# A HOME DELIVERY CHAMPION



“Very early on, Loaves & Fishes was able to be flexible and change to a new way of operating to serve the community,” Bob Young remembers. When COVID-19 began impacting our community, Bob stepped up to do what he could. Bob works for the United Way of Central Carolinas and when Mecklenburg Co. put together an emergency response team, Bob was appointed the deputy director of VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster). He connected patients affected by COVID-19 with resources like Loaves & Fishes that could provide groceries while people were quarantined in their houses or were lacking resources due to job loss. Bob managed a fleet of volunteers to help with home deliveries. He recounted, “Our volunteers were blessed to be part of this process because they could tell it was a real need.” Not only did Bob refer over 2,500 clients since March 2020, but he delivered around 350 of those himself. Bob is a regular at our Loaves & Fishes Mobile Pantries, picking up food to deliver to clients and a hunger hero to all of us at Loaves & Fishes!

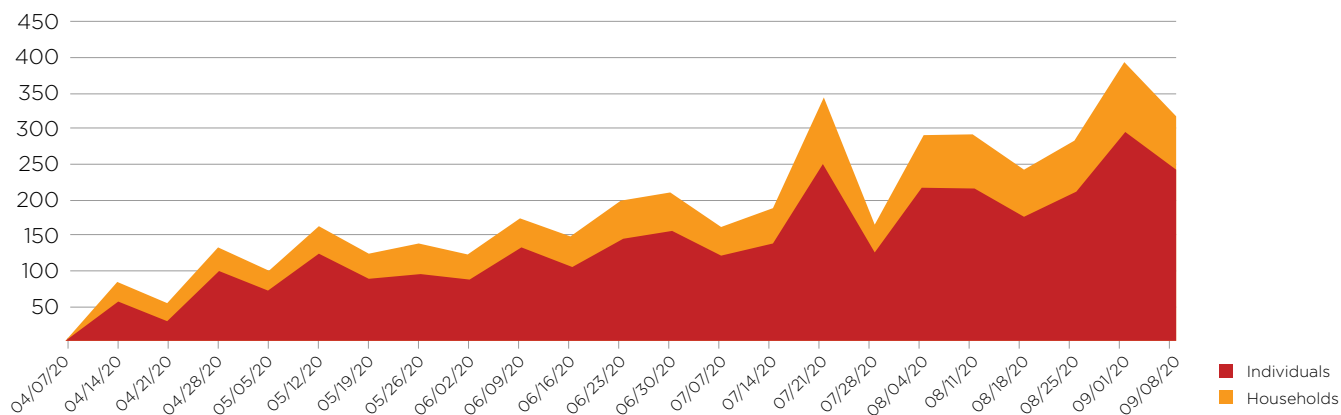
